- Age 21-65
- every 3-5yr

Anal

 Age 30+ (if PLWH)

• Annual pap

Breast

- Start age 40-50
- Mammogram every 1-2yr

Colorectal

- Age 45+
- FIT annual or colonoscopy every 10yr

Lung

- Age 50-80 (if 20 packyears in the last 15yr)
- Annual chest CT

Prostate

Age 55-69Annual PSA


