




SAN DIEGO COLORECTAL CANCER SCREENING ROUNDTABLE

Present Efforts to Increase Medi-Cal Managed Care Colorectal Cancer Screening Rates

- Coordination of the efforts of C4, ACS, ACS/CAN, and CDOC to provide resources and expertise to aid the Quality & Health Equity Division of the California Department of Health Care to help increase colorectal cancer screening.
- Develop a program to aid <u>NCI-Designated Cancer Centers</u> to increase Medi-Cal Colorectal Cancer Screening in the Health Plans in their catchment areas.
- Develop a program designed to help the American Cancer Society work with selected health plans to increase their colorectal cancer screening rates.

Present Efforts with DHCS and Lessons to Date

Meetings with Priya Motz, DO, MPH, CHCQM Quality & Health Equity
Transformation Branch Chief California Department of Healthcare services
Quality & Health Equity Division California Department of Health Care
Services and her team coordinated by CDOC including C4, ACS.

Results of these meetings to date:

- 1. C4, CDOC and ACS will meet with the Medi-Cal Medical directors.
- 2. C4 and ACS will review the DHCS CRC screening education materials.
- 3. C4 and ACS will provide needed education materials that debunk the myth that the colonoscopy is the gold standard of CRC screening.
- 4. Continued supports for CRC screening to be a Medi-Cal Quality Measure which it holds MCPs accountable to meet minimum performance levels in 2025.

Methods of Screening

- Colonoscopy
- CT colonoscopy
- Flexible sigmoidoscopy
- Fecal occult blood testing (FOBT)
- Fecal immunochemical test (FIT)
- Fecal DNA testing



Health Plan Efforts to Increase Screening

- Patient incentives to increase screening
 - 2024: colonoscopy
 - 2023: colonoscopy or FIT testing
 - Provider participation in Pay for Performance related to CRC screening
 - Individual efforts by FQHCs



- Frequent communication/education required
