4. Support advocacy & public policy efforts

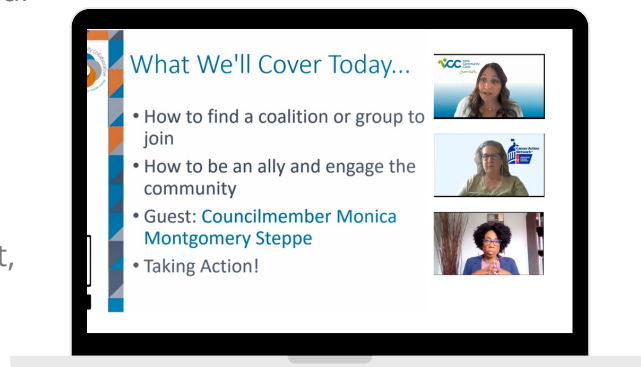
Welcome to Cynthia Knapp, our 2022 CHEC Community Co-Chair!
